
Chandler Gilbert Community College - CGCC has graciously provided us with Mr. Kenneth Creech our very own representative. He is now enrolling students in the following programs:

ACE - <u>The ACE program</u> is a Concurrent Enrollment program through Chandler-Gilbert Community College that allows high school students to complete up to 24 college credits for free. **Sophomore students** must meet two or more of the following to qualify:

- First-Generation College Student (Meaning neither parent has a college degree)
- Single parent household
- Underrepresented Group (Race/Ethnicity, Religion, Males, etc.)
- Economic Hardship
- Foster Care/Temporary Housing
- Teen Parent

(applicants need to meet 2 of the criteria below)

- First-generation to attend college
- Students working 10-20 hours
- Evidence of single parent household
- Underrepresented ethnicity
- Environmental factors such as teen
 - parent, temporary housing, foster care



Preparing for College: Summer and Enrichment Programs

- University of Arizona's Med Start Program The Med-Start Health Careers Program is a summer academic enrichment program for 11th grade Arizona high school students interested in pursuing a career in the health sciences. Students participate in the program during the summer between their junior and senior years. Deadline to apply is February 1st, 2021
- <u>University of Arizona's Saturday Scrubs Program</u> Saturday Scrubs is a free program designed to encourage and inspire Arizona high school students to explore their existing interest in becoming a physician. Each Saturday Scrubs event is intended to introduce participants to a variety of topics related to medicine and the human body. Every session includes lectures by medical professionals and hands-on/interactive activities. This program is being held at their Phoenix Campus.
- <u>Carnegie Mellon Pre-College Summer Programs</u> we are looking for students who are excited by their subject of interest and who strive for success both inside and outside of the classroom. Students who create and save a college list on BigFuture[™] with six or more schools will earn an entry to this scholarship.



Practice for the SAT

Open Through October

Students who start using Official SAT® Practice on Khan Academy® by completing a Timed Mini Section (if they already have a PSAT-related assessment or SAT score) or Diagnostic Quiz (if they don't yet have a score) will earn an entry to this scholarship.

Going Merry is completely different from the older scholarship search engines:

- Matching Once you fill out your profile, you are automatically matched with scholarships you are most eligible for.
- Direct Applications You can apply directly to multiple scholarships, you never need to leave the site.
- Autofilled Applications All of the information from your profile is auto filled into each application, saving you time.
- Estimated Application Times Every scholarship has estimated application time to help you prioritize them.

• Scholarships Grouped By Essay Topics - Scholarships are grouped by common essay topics so you can minimize the number of essays you have to write.
