


College & Career Bulletin – September 2021

Financial Aid Information and Events- We want to make sure that college stays affordable for our students so in October we have multiple events tailored to helping you understand financial aid applications. Students who apply for the FAFSA open up the chance to receive merit scholarships and other financial aid from the college they are attending!

Be A Leader Foundation - initially began as a scholarship organization with supports for families of Junior High students with the financial resources and mentoring needed to complete their education. Be A Leader has also established multiple partnerships with local school districts, postsecondary institutions, corporations, nonprofits and municipal entities throughout Arizona. Every Eastmark Junior will take the ASVAB on Wednesday, September 28th. It is a valuable career assessment tool which can help identify which career is best for each student. Since the test is an aptitude test, it will also inform test takers what their weaknesses are. Though the test is developed by the Department of Defense, it is not just for those going into the military. It's a great start to finding the perfect career for students by highlighting those skills which students naturally have. Even if you know what field you want to go into after high school, it's still a good idea to know your strengths and weaknesses. Remember: the test isn't about failing or passing; it's about figuring out what things you're already good at so that you can make informed career decisions. The test will help better prepare students for their future.

- 1. General Science (GS)
- 2. Arithmetic Reasoning (AR)
- Word Knowledge (WK)
- Paragraph Comprehension (PC)
- Mathematics Knowledge (MK)
- 6. Electronics Information (EI)
- Auto & Shop Information (AS)
- Mechanical Comprehension (MC)
- 9. Assembling Objects (AO)

PSAT 8/9 and PSAT NMSQT - we will be conducting the PSAT this year again for students who are looking for College in their Post High School plans. The test will be Tuesday, October 25th here on campus.

The **PSAT 8/9** measures what you're learning in school and helps determine if you're on track for high school and beyond.

The **PSAT NMSQT** offers the opportunity to connect to \$300 million in scholarships, Juniors taking the test are eligible for the National Merit Scholarship Program, students will learn their academic strengths and with the Khan Academy partnership, students can create a personalized SAT study plan.

You can register your student for these tests through your parentvue under fees

PSAT 8/9: Costs \$20 PSAT NMSQT Costs \$25

Payment deadline is TODA Sept 9th 2022. Once you pay, your student is signed up for the test. Feel free to contact us or your counselor for additional questions.

Going Merry is completely different from the older scholarship search engines:

- Matching Once you fill out your profile, you are automatically matched with scholarships you are most eligible for.
- Direct Applications You can apply directly to multiple scholarships, you never need to leave the site.
- Autofilled Applications All of the information from your profile is autofilled into each application, saving you time.
- Estimated Application Times Every scholarship has estimated application time to help you prioritize them.
- Scholarships Grouped By Essay Topics Scholarships are grouped by common essay topics so you can minimize the number of essays you have to write.
